



Picture with me for a moment the future UK Church. What will it look like?

I recently met Pastor Simeon Akindele, of The Redeemed Christian Church of God, Living Faith House, in Brockley, London. Simeon told me this story:

"Last Christmas, our church family gave gifts to a group of local white British pensioners to celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus. They were shocked and overwhelmed by this act of kindness, and from an African and Caribbean church no less!

"Why should they be surprised by this? It saddened me to see the divide between our cultures. Skin colour is of little importance when it comes to the body of Christ – we are all children of God."



Like Simeon, I am asking: what will the UK Church look like in 10, 50, 100 years' time? What will your church look like? Will it be a distinct, separate, monochrome gathering of people?

Or a vibrant, diverse group of passionate people from different ethnic backgrounds coming together as one <u>people</u> – just as the three wise men came to worship the Christ-child – all those years ago?

There's something about this picture that excites me. It's not just a nativity scene. It reflects the creativity of the God we serve. It's part of God's plan for His Church – a place where all divides are bridged.

That's why we at the Evangelical Alliance are committed to making this picture a reality - but we need your help.

Your past generosity enabled us to form the One People Commission – a group of key national church leaders from across ethnic backgrounds, already including representatives from African and Caribbean churches, the Chinese Church, the Korean Church, South African churches, the South Asian Forum and of course white British Christians.

As this Commission <u>celebrates diversity while promoting unity</u>, we are seeing divides bridged, stereotypes crushed and a united vision for the Church in this country articulated.

We are the first to admit that in the past the Alliance has not been fully representative of the diversity of the UK Church. For this we are truly sorry. The voice of united Christians needs to be heard in the media, in parliament and in our own communities. And we need to ensure that our voice is truly representative of all God's people. We believe we're better together – and that means all of us.

It means you too.
