# Who we're looking for

The Evangelical Alliance is the largest and oldest body representing the UK's two million evangelical Christians. For 180 years, we have been bringing Christians together and helping them to listen to, and be heard by, the government, media and society.

We are seeking an advocacy and policy co-ordinator to implement our advocacy strategy in Wales by engaging with the activities of the Senedd, Welsh Government and related political structures. The post-holder will represent the voice of evangelicals to elected representatives in the Senedd, policymakers and the media. You will engage with individual, church and organisational members of the Evangelical Alliance in order to analyse and inform public policy consultations at the Senedd and contribute to the wider work of the Evangelical Alliance team in Wales.

The successful candidate will have:

- Experience of influencing policy by building relationships with elected representatives and government ministers.
- A good knowledge of political processes and major issues of public debate.
- Research experience, with good analytical and briefing skills.
- The ability to take initiative, with excellent communication, organisational and relational skills.
- The ability and motivation to address political issues from an evangelical Christian perspective.

# About the role

**Responsible to:** Operationally responsible to the head of the Evangelical Alliance in Wales (day-to-day line management)  
  
Strategically responsible to the director of advocacy, Evangelical Alliance UK (leads in goal and objective setting)

## Overall purpose:

- To implement the UK advocacy strategy in Wales by engaging with the activities of the Senedd, Welsh Government and related political structures.
- To represent the voice of evangelicals to elected representatives in the Senedd, policymakers and the media.
- To engage with individual, church and organisation members, across Wales, in line with Wales team strategy, in order to analyse public policy and inform engagement at the Senedd.
- To analyse and report upon public policy and legislation in Wales from an evangelical Christian perspective.

## Main responsibilities:

The role is part of the Evangelical Alliance team in Wales, contributing to the wider work of the team. The post-holder will be required to work on their own initiative, and to plan and prioritise their work to deliver quality outputs to tight deadlines.

- To implement the Evangelical Alliance's UK advocacy strategy in Wales under the day-to-day operational direction of the head of the Evangelical Alliance in Wales, and in liaison with the director of advocacy review the effectiveness of the advocacy strategy suggesting revisions as necessary.
- To liaise with the head of public policy in monitoring the activities of the Welsh Government, government departments, political parties and other relevant groups, producing monthly and annual reports for the head of public policy.
- To proactively build strategic relationships with elected members of the Senedd, advisers, civil servants, media and others concerned with government, public affairs and public services in Wales, in order to monitor their activities, offer support and represent evangelical perspectives to those groups.
- To analyse and comment upon current and potential public policy and legislation from a Christian perspective in collaboration with the UK advocacy team.
- To attend and represent evangelical members at the Faith Communities Forum, the Cross-Party Group on Faith and other policy forums following May 2026 Senedd elections.

- To inform Evangelical Alliance members in Wales and others of major political and socially important developments relevant to the advocacy strategy; to encourage prayer and other appropriate responses.
- To assist churches in Wales as they seek to engage in the public square, both at a national (Wales) and local level within the framework of the advocacy strategy, where necessary, providing advice and practical assistance where possible.
- To monitor the Welsh media as it reports and offer comment on matters of concern to evangelicals in accordance with the advocacy strategy.
- To speak at churches and other events promoting advocacy and the general work of the Evangelical Alliance in Wales.
- To collaborate with the head of public policy in engaging Welsh MPs in Westminster by producing parliamentary briefings, attend meetings and produce policy reports.

**There are some activities which apply to all members of staff, and these are listed below:**

- To further the aims and objectives of the Evangelical Alliance.
- To support the values of the Evangelical Alliance.
- To undertake training/personal development through participation in the Evangelical Alliance's performance review programme.
- To manage one's own learning and contribute to the learning of others.
- To take part in other Evangelical Alliance activities arranged centrally or by other teams where appropriate.
- To participate in and take turn in leading staff prayers and staff worship.

# ANNUAL REPORT SNAPSHOT 2024-25

**T**he Lord has shown us such grace and favour this year. Firstly, I want to say a huge welcome to the more than 5,500 personal members who joined the Evangelical Alliance this year. To all our members, almost 27,000 of you, thank you! We are profoundly grateful that you stand with us.

As the UK prepared for a general election, we published our *Thinking faithfully about politics* research, designed to help Christians put their faith at the heart of how they engage with politics, and to help policymakers and the media to better understand evangelicals. Following the election, we continued to be a voice speaking up in government. Our members have united on important issues, spanning from the beginning to the end of life, in prayer and in action.

This year we released several new resources to equip our members to lead with confidence and compassion in challenging times, including the

*Relationships Matter* course on the Bible, sexuality and same-sex relationships; *In Crisis* videos for church and organisation leaders; and *Visions of Justice and Hope*, a small group resource designed to facilitate conversations on racial justice. It has been a privilege to meet with hundreds of church leaders individually to support and encourage them too.

As we look ahead, I am reminded of the words Jesus prayed for His followers in John 17, which have always been foundational to the work of the Evangelical Alliance throughout our history, “that they may be one as we are one – I in them and you in me – so that they may be brought to complete unity. Then the world will know that you sent me.” Be assured I’m praying for you all as we seek to make Jesus known together.

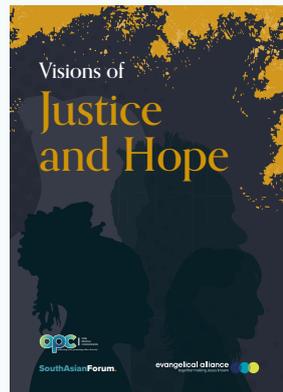

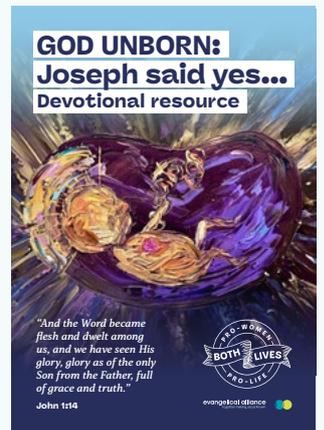

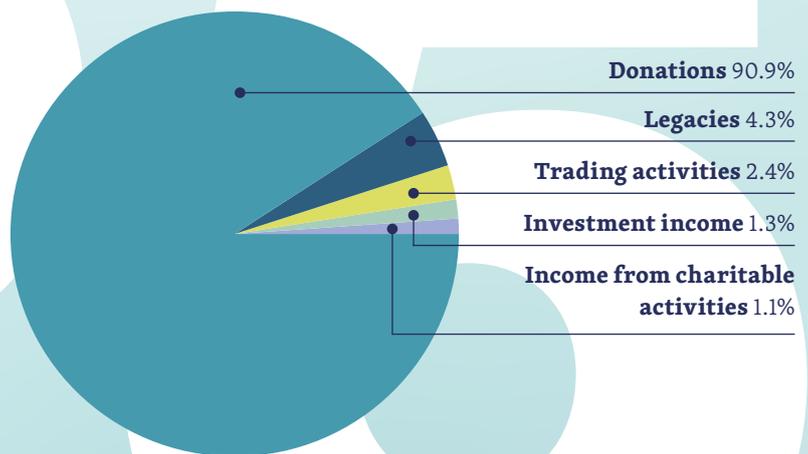

Unity and mission initiatives 39.6%



Diolch i chi am gymryd yr amser i ystyried gwneud cais i'r Cynghrair Efengylaidd. Ein gweddi ydy y bydd Duw yn arwain y bobl iawn aton ni.

Y Cynghrair Efengylaidd ydy'r corff mwyaf a'r hynaf sy'n gwasanaethu Cristnogion efengylaidd yn y DU. Ers 1846, rydyn ni wedi bod yn uno Cristnogion a sicrhau llais iddyn nhw yng nghoridorau grym. Rydyn ni hefyd wedi bod yn galluogi eglwysi ar gyfer cenhadaeth; yn eu hysbrydoli i arwain trawsnewidiad ysbrydol, cymdeithasol a chorfforol eu cymunedau.

Yn Ioan 17 – gweddi olaf Iesu – mae Crist yn gweddio fel hyn: “Fi ynddyn nhw a ti ynof fi.
